MANKIVELL NOTEBOOK

Introduction

MANKIVELL is an old and distinguished name having origins in Cornwall, England, before the 14th century.

Experts in the Celtic language of early Cornwall differ as to the meaning of the name. Some authorities believe the name means 'Valley of the Horse'. Others insist the name means 'Glen of Woodcocks'. Still others think the name may mean 'Sweet One'.

There are several stories about origins of the Nankivell clan. No doubt early Nankivell family history is part of the history of the people of Cornwall, whose roots are in the Celtic race. The Celts were Indo-Europeans of Southern Germany known to have existed in the Bronze Age, c1000 B.C. Celts occupied large parts of Eastern Europe and Gaul, Spain, Britain, Scotland and Ireland. Since Anglo-Saxon settlements never reached far into Cornwall, Celtic place names still predominate there.

It is said that people (Celts?) from the Iberian Peninsula came to England about the time of Christ looking for tin, which at that time could be picked up from the surface of the earth.

Some persons believe the Nankivell family came from France with William the Conqueror in 1066. However, a check of the 'Roll of the Battle Abbey', the list of knights who survived the Battle of Hastings, finds no one bearing a surname even resembling 'Nankivell' or 'Nanteuil'.

There is also the tale of Nankivell survivors of the Spanish Armada of 1588. That expedition was a rout and it is thought there could have been no survivors reaching the shores of Cornwall. It is also to be noted the MANKIVELL name was already established in Cornwall by 1588.

Then there is the story of Huguenots who brought the MANKIVELL name to England when they were forced to flee from France. It is true Huguenot immigrants married into Nankivell families. However, the name seems to have been established before the arrival of Huguenots.

Just before 1800, ores ... copper and tin, silver and lead ... were discovered in the region of Tavistock - Marytavy, Devon. Cornish miners took jobs in the various mines that opened. As the mines of Tavistock became depleted miners contracted their services for specified lengths of time at overseas locations in Mexico, South America and Africa. A number of Nankivell families became pioneers in those far-away places of Australia and New Zealand.

When in their new homes it was found more men were wanted for the mines, the immigrants always knew somebody at home for the work: Cousin Jack. So Cornishmen all over the world have become known as 'Cousin Jack'; the womenfolk are called 'Cousin Jennie'.

By 'Tre Ros Car Nan Pol Pen

MANKIVELL NOTEBOOK began as a list of names and addresses from telephone directories around the English-speaking world. To this was added a list of individual records concerning births, baptisms, marriages, and deaths, mostly of England, from International Genealogical Index (IGI). Other lists of records, census data, some wills have been examined.

Happily, MANKIVELL NOTEBOOK has grown from mere listings of names. In answer to query letters, individuals have sent results of their personal research into their own family roots. Interesting bits of family history and unique insights into the lives of some family members have also been included.

MANKIVELL NOTEBOOK is now a large collection of genealogical histories describing several large family groups and hundreds of small families, single households and individuals. The histories begin with family members bearing the Nankivell surname and include descendants whatever the surname to the present day.

The oldest record of the family name is the mention of 'Mansouvel' on the Assize Rolls of Cornwall in 1277. There are several later records where names of similar spelling are mentioned.

Over the years the spelling of the surname has changed so that in the modern world we find many variations. Worldwide the most popular is Nankivell, but Mancekivell is often seen in North Devon, England, and Ontario, CAN.

It is often said that family members are buried as Nan(ce)kivell but live as Kivell. The name Kivell is widely used, but not all persons using the name are of English extraction with roots in Cornwall or Devon.

Probably the largest number of persons bearing the Nankivell name are living in Australia. However in New Zealand there is probably a larger number of Nankivells if expressed as a percentage of total population. England is probably in third place using either method of count.

The oldest continuous history of Nankivells begins in Saint Columb Major, Cornwall, about 1400 when the lands of Nankivell came into possession of a King's Herald by name of Typpett. For several generations the family name was hyphenated as Typpett-Nankivell; later the Typpett was dropped.

Nankivells are recorded as living in Truro, Cornwall, from about 1600. The Truro family is widely believed to be a branch of the St. Columb Major family but exact ties cannot be shown. Many references to persons bearing the Nankivell surname from 1600 to 1700 can be found in Cornish communities such as St. Austel, St. Stephen in Brannel, St. Ewe, Parransabuloe and Ruan Lanihorne.

From Cornwall Nankivells spread throughout England. Then with poor economic conditions in England in the mid 19th century, Nankivells from all parts of England migrated to countries around the world. Today Nankivells are found in England, Australia, New Zealand, Canada, United States of America and Republic of South Africa.

It was in 1840 that two sons of Ann Rogers and Thomas Nankivell of Marytavy, Devon, were among first English settlers to New Zealand. Descendants are numerous in New Zealand and Australia. Two small family branches are represented in USA. A large genealogical history has been developed for this family.

After 1852 when gold was discovered in Australia, many Nankivells migrated there. They often put their mining earnings into farm lands; many of these lands remain in the hands of descendants. Several large and moderate-sized histories are under development.

The several Nankivells who came to USA had small families. Only small histories have been possible and in general exact ties to their English past remains unknown.

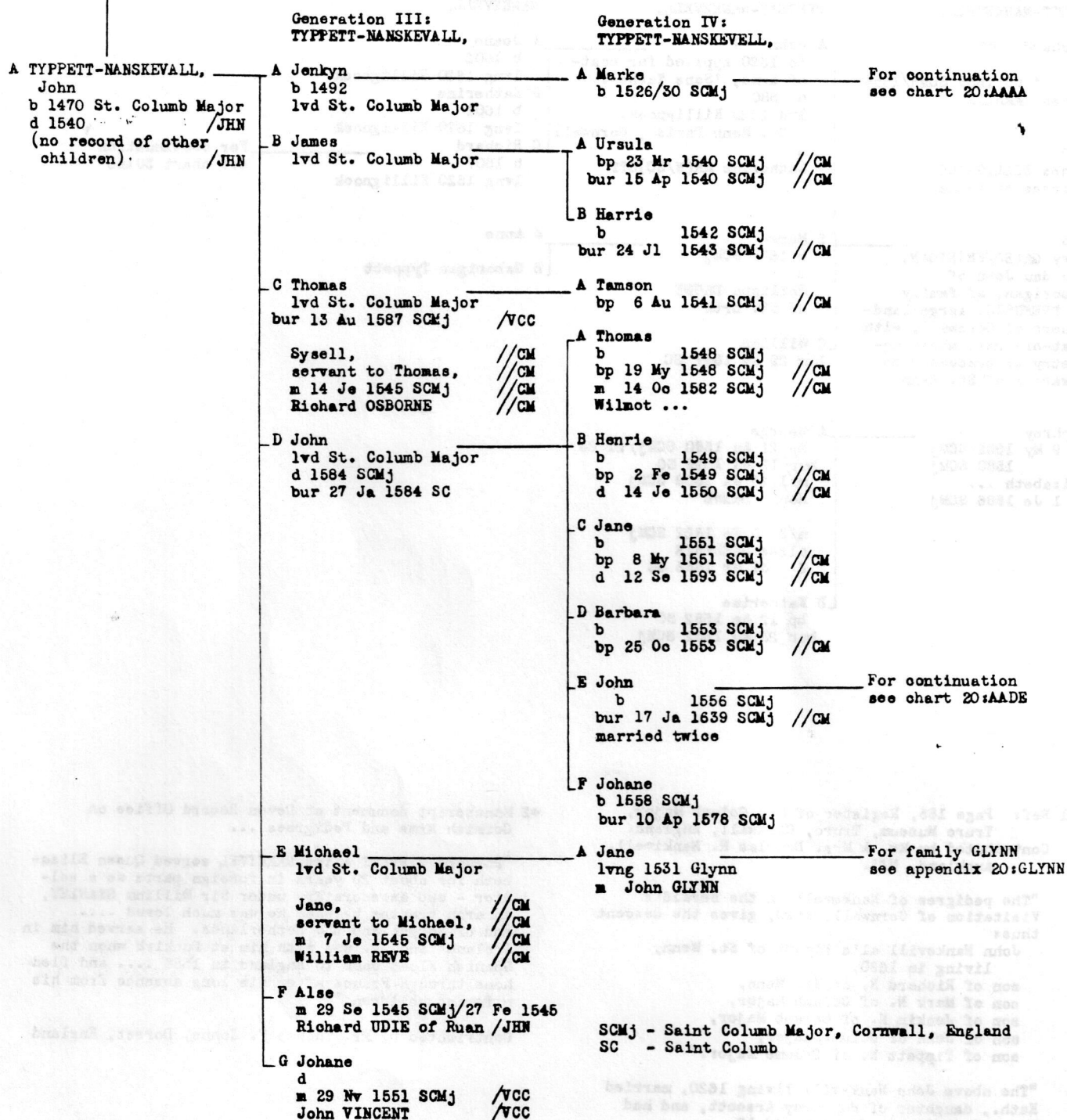

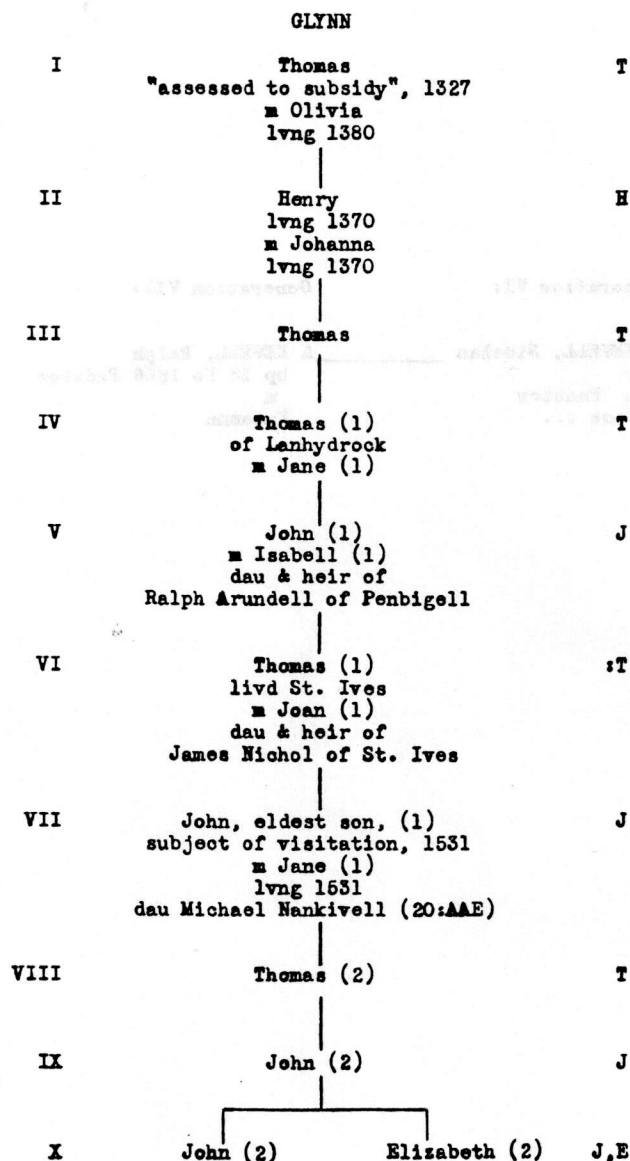

The Protestation Returns of 1641/2 comprise a list of all male parishioners of the age of 18 and over. In the last week of February or the first week of March, the Parish Priest read the Protestation in Church and the parishioners signed or made a mark before him and the officials, who testified it had been taken or named the refusers. Returns of Cornwall are most complete of all the counties.

The following Protestation was signed:

I,, in presence of Almighty God, promise, vow and protest to maintain and defend, as far as lawfully I may, with my Life, Power and Estate, the true Reformed Protestant Religion, expressed in the Doctrine of the Church of England, against all Popery and Popish Innovations within this Realm, contrary to the same Doctrine, according to the Duty of my Allegiance, His Majesty's Royal Person, Honour and Estate, etc.

There are no records for Jacobstow, Truro, St. Austell or St. Neot.

An excerpt from the letter:

"Tippett alias Nankivell: what these aliases mean must be a matter of conjecture. They are certainly more common in Cornwall than elsewhere. Some were adopted so that one person could be distinguished from another of the same name; this attitude applied also to such as the Michells who left out the 't' because they did not want to be confused with that ordinary lot who lived in the next parish - or the Williams, Williams; the Jenkyns, Jenkins; and a lot more. You also get aliases used as a combination of family name and place name - where Tippett might be the accepted surname and Nankivell the name of the place where they lived (although I am not saying this is necessarily true of Tippett/Nankivell).

"Today, of course, you can have this chosen combination of husband's and wife's surnames, but I do not know if this was a common practice in the 15th/16th centuries. Indeed I would have thought people had more sense. However, it is true that for two centuries Cornish people have had this useful habit of using the wife's surname as a second Christian name for their children - this practice often makes genealogy easier.

"I am sure it would be possible to pick up the odd Nankivell (aren't all Nankivells odd? I am sure all Douchs are) before 1400, but it is extremely unlikely that you would be able to connect them to yours in a firm line. The Truro Nankivell was a wine-merchant."

"As regards all those Nankivells looking for their roots, there will be scraps of information for them to nose out and I shall be pleased to help if and when they ask."

Lineages for Doctors in Nankivell Family
of Saint Columb Major, Cornwall, England

The history begins with the 11th generation
of the record of the family's genealogy.

CERTIFICATE OF ATTENDANCE
at
WILLIAM SMELLIE'S LECTURES, 1757

The certificate described in this note has been handed down through six generations of doctors in my family in almost direct line. It has been hidden away in the cupboard with the family skeletons, and is seeing the light of day now only because of its two hundredth anniversary. There is a note written on the back saying: 'This is of interest to the family only and should be handed down to the senior medical member of each generation.' I feel, however, that it may well prove to be of interest to others, especially those who have studied the history of medicine and the life of William Smellie in particular.

The James Nankivell to whom the certificate was issued was born on 29 August 1736 and died on 14 March 1822. He practised as a surgeon at Wadebridge in Cornwall. In Professor R.N. Johnstone's most interesting and comprehensive book, "William Smellie, the Master of British Midwifery" (1952) there are illustrations of the syllabus of Smellie's Course of Lectures upon midwifery and of his 'Conditions', dated 1743, and setting out the fees for single and multiple courses. It has been estimated that he gave about 280 of these courses to a total of about 900 pupils, during his teaching years in London between 1741 and 1759. The College of Physicians of London did not institute its Licence in Midwifery until 1783. Only ten of these licences were granted, the first to Thomas Denman and William Osborn on 22 December 1783, and the last to Robert Batty on 30 September 1800. There is no doubt that the certificates of attendance at their lectures and courses issued by Smellie, William Hunter, Lowder, Orme and other celebrated teachers of midwifery were highly valued.

Smellie's courses consisted of:

- (1) Anatomical Lectures on the Pelvis and Uterus.
- (2) The Foetus in Utero and after Parturition.
- (3) Ante-Natal and Post-Natal Management of the Child-Bearing Woman.
- (4) Demonstrations on his Machines of Normal and Abnormal Labour.

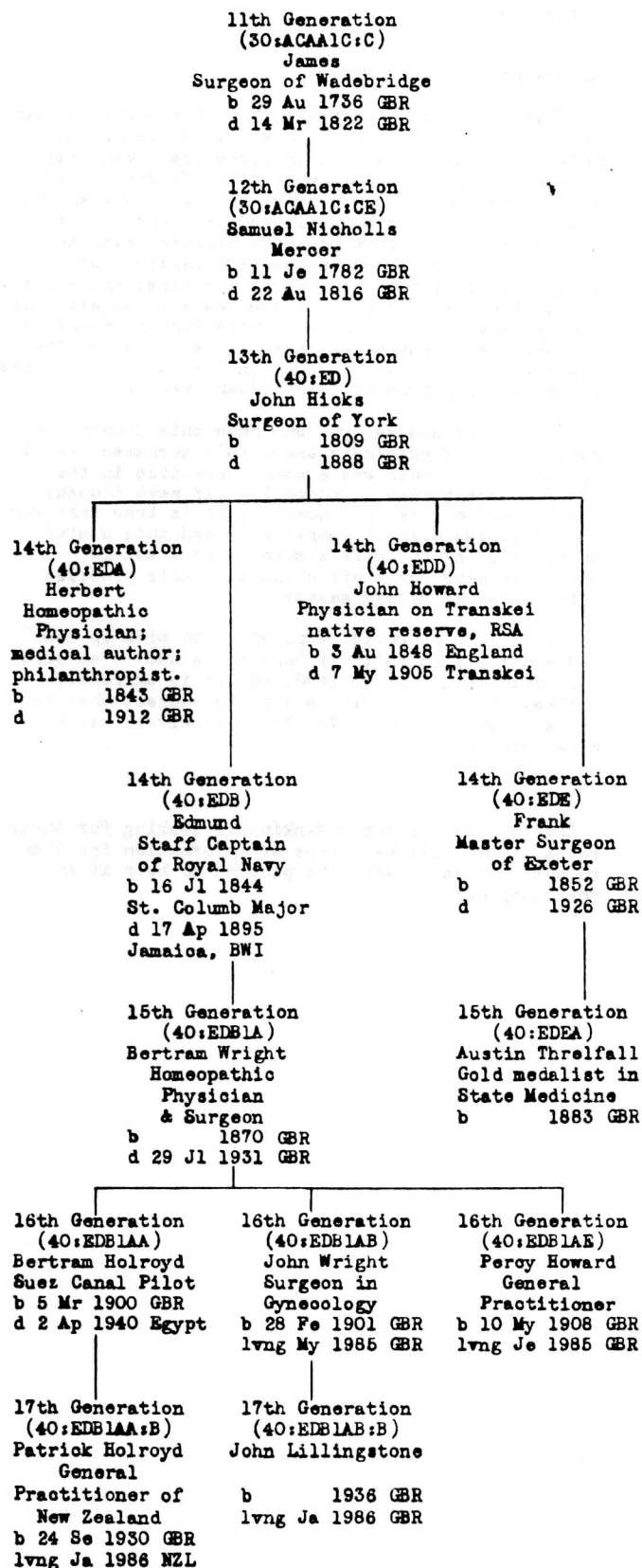
A single course was divided into twelve lectures and lasted two weeks. The fee was two guineas with an extra guinea for attendance at an actual labour.

A much higher proportion of complicated labours prevailed in those days, owing to the prevalence of malformation of the pelvis from rickets, etc., and the lack of ante-natal supervision. Caesarian sections were not yet performed on the living mother, and obstructed labours often finished up with craniotomies with both patient and midwife prostrated with exhaustion. It is understandable, therefore, that Smellie encouraged pupils to take longer courses of one or even two years, when they paid twenty guineas, and were present at and even conducted difficult cases.

My dear Valerie;

My half sister Kathleen L. M. Nankivell has forwarded me your exceedingly interesting letter of the 30th, knowing that I am very keen on genealogy and have kept a record of all I have gathered of our Cornish family.

.....

I can quite sympathise with your grief at leaving school, as I remember, even now, at the age of 74, what a wrench it was to be torn from the Bedford High School just as I had been top of 5B and was going into the matric. class. My brother had just passed his matric. and we had to move to London to make a home for him, while he studied at the Middlesex Hospital Medical School. He and I always lived with our grandmother, who had the early Victorian ideas of exclusiveness and class distinction, and would not hear of my going to any local school, to mix with tradesmen's daughters. Fancy having to wait till you are in heaven before you can have intercourse with your fellow creatures! So I was doomed to be house-keeper, companion and isolationist for the duration of her life, which ended at 94! It was a tough lesson to submit my will and high ambition to God's better plan. I cried for three nights, and tried to look cheerful by day, but it was long before my restive heart could say:

"God holds the key of all unknown
And I am glad
For if some other held the key
Or if He offered it to me
I might be sad."

Eventually I was allowed to study art, earned many certificates and exhibited, and two or three days a week helped in parish work and Sunday School teaching. I hoped when free to become a missionary - the hope of being a medical one, excluded. After that I kept house again for my Gran and brother for three years in Bournemouth; then he married and had 5 sons and one daughter all of whom married and had 2 or 3 children. For 20 years my Gran and I lived in the suburbs of Bournemouth, to help with the children and have his medical care for her. When she was 91 I became engaged to the Home Business Manager of the China Inland Mission; my brother took entire charge of our Gran, and I have lived in Leytonstone for the last 30 years. My husband died of heart failure and shook 4 days after our home was blasted by a land mine, in Oct 1940. Only two months ago the roof, ceilings, doors and windows were repaired; but I still have no glass in the conservatories. The house is my own, freehold, with 8 rooms, in a nice neighborhood on top of a hill; near enough to shops, library and buses.

I let the upper floor furnished to two parties: the two front rooms to a young married couple and the two back ones to a business lady - all out from 8 AM to 6 PM.

My husband had one son by his first wife, William John Baker. He is married and has a son, John, who came home from Shanghai last Nov. and is now in a boarding school at Eltham. He will be 13 in August. Our son is in the Scottish Bible Soc. as agent and is also an ordained Baptist minister. His wife, Eleanor, and daughter, Helen Jean, are still in Shanghai. They were all 4 interned by the Japs 2½ years. They hope to come Home in a few months and find a home near John's school, where they could spend fur-lough and remain (mother and daughter) while the father returns for another 5 years work in China. Meanwhile I have John during his holidays or arrange where he can go at seaside or country. Do you know of any nice farm where school boys are received to work for their keep?

.....

I, like some of my S.African cousins, am a Baptist. Others of the Nankivells are R.C.s or nothing in particular. Three generations back all were Anglicans. The main thing is to know that you are saved and saved to love and serve.

I do pray for all that is right and best for you.

My dear Valerie;

Many thanks for your cheery letter, and hearty congratulations on your splendid exam results. A foundation like that will be a great gain through life, what ever you take up. Do not ever think I am bored with anything that interests you. My own are very wide, and I shall love to hear how you get on. I did pray that the way might open for you to continue your studies without a break. It is just marvellous your father's home-coming clearing the way like this. ...

I do not know how much of our family tree my half-sister, Kathleen, has sent you, but I do not think she would copy the whole. It is rather cumbersome, as it grows down the centuries, in spite of the many offshoots that are lopped off, of which we have no trace.

You may be quite sure that all the Tippetts, descended from the early branch that acquired the property known as "Nanskevall" are of Cornish extraction. They took the name of the estate, as the Scottish people often do. It is Cornish, Gaelic for "Valley of Woodcocks", our crest was a woodcock, and there would be no other place exactly so named, unless founded and named by a member of the family. It seems a pity that the Dutch section should sever the 'Nan'. As for the Huguenot idea, the Nanskevals were in possession at least as early as Henry VII's time, before the Huguenots migrated to this land. The name should be pronounced in the Cornish way Nan-kivell, but we have always found that English people like to call us Nank-ivell, with the accent on the last syllable. It is rather barbarous of our artist-relative to hyphen or sever the Nan and call himself Dutch.

The Truro Nankivells have tremendous families and are difficult to fit in. When I was last at Truro, on coming out of the station, I was met by the name writ large over a Timber yard; so there are still some in the old home. Unfortunately my genealogy ends that branch a century ago, and I have never had time or opportunity to make it up. There are still several in Melbourne, Australia, also in Newcastle, Bristol, etc. and look in the clergy lists and medical directories of past years.

My grandson, John Baker, left me on Wed. evening as he begins term on the 19th. We are expecting his parents and sister home from Shanghai about Nov 1st, after 13 years absence from our shores. It will be Helen Jean's first visit as she is only 6, and spent last furlough at Los Angeles.

Its colour fascinated me. Our eastern counties produce dark brown honey, as if made from low-grade Demerara sugar, and the flavour is not nearly so dainty. So Cornish honey, as well as clotted cream, takes the top place.

I hope you will enjoy your trip to Austria, but it can be terribly cold. An artist friend of mine went skating there with a friend of hers, and did well on the ice. But coming home with her skates slung over her neck, she slipped on the road and out her arm to the bone a wide gash that left its mark for life. It is wiser to carry them in a satchel.

The fogs here have been dense and blinding, and have spread asthma, nasal catarrh, laryngitis &c, &c as well as road accidents. I feel so thankful not to have to go out. One friend or another turns up to do my shopping and keep me supplied with necessaries. So far I have not been able to get gifts or cards, so I just write my greetings and good wishes to you all.

Do you know the Odham's Book Club? Books normally costing 92/- the half dozen are 27/- to club members and well up to date. But best sellers are not often the kind I should choose. However I have been glad to get "The Bible in Pictures" and Pilgrim's Progress. I have nearly finished colouring the 360 photogravures of the New Testament. It makes them so much easier for children to understand; it is a pity reproduction in colour is so expensive.

I was interested in hearing from Selma of Rex Nankivell and his success as an artist. He must have branched off before my grandfather's time; but from the time of Henry VII so many have changed the spelling.

Will and Pat have asked me to Sidcup again this Christmas, so weather and health permitting I shall enjoy the family gathering.

If you can squeeze in another 3 ozs with your luggage, I should be glad if you would give a copy of my book on the after life to your Austrian hostess. It has helped some people who needed assurance that life continues, though unseen generally to those in the body.

Since the labour unrest last year, Mr. Nankivell has received an amount of publicity in the English Press such as few Colonial servants of his rank command. This has been due to his outspoken and candid speech at the close of the Strike last year, and a desire, which Mr. Ormsby-Gore was suspected of entertaining, of making a scapegoat of him. It is well that the Colonial Office was not so ill-advised as to victimize this officer; because such a course would have had a disastrous effect upon good feeling between the people of Trinidad and the Imperial Government. As it is, the attachment of Trinidadians to Britain has been severely strained by the language used by the former Secretary of State for the Colonies in the debate on the Colonial Estimates a few months ago.

As Chairman of the Nutrition Committee, as Acting Colonial Secretary, and as a member of several other Committees too numerous to mention Mr. Nankivell has impressed those who made contact with him by his straightforwardness, zeal, and high civic spirit. Nor must we omit to mention that he has been sustained and encouraged to give of his best to the Colony by his wife, whose social work in Trinidad has earned her in her right a warm place in the affections of the mothers and sisters of Trinidad. We are sure that, in their distant home in Cyprus, Mr. and Mrs. Nankivell will remember Trinidad as a land to which they gave devoted and unselfish service in the morning of their marriage, and that those on whose behalf they laboured have warmly appreciated their good work. We trust that before they leave the Colony some fitting token of Trinidad's gratitude will be given to them. They have our best wishes for their continued happiness.

References: Letter from Mr. Simon F. Nankivell of Kamloops, British Columbia, Canada, to Miss Edith L. Nankivell of Joppatowne, Maryland, USA at time Edith was making genealogical inquiries, September 1985.

"Wendy and I have lived here in Kamloops for 13 years now, with our two sons, Nathan (9) and Justin (13). This city is located in the centre of British Columbia at the northernmost extent of the Grasslands and is partial desert land. It's very rugged country and most beautiful, with a long winter and short hot summer. We are fortunate enough to have our own home where we've lived for 13 years, situated by the river on 1/2 acre of land, with lots of trees of all types.

"Wendy is by profession a librarian and is the children's coordinator at the Kamloops Public Library here in town. Her library serves an area of about 70,000 people, most of the interior population in this region. I am a secondary school teacher, specializing in English and Spanish at one of the local high schools. I have taught at NorKam school for 13 years, since I moved here. Our children attend Brooklehurst Secondary and Parkcrest Elementary schools, close to where we live.

"We have a great number of hobbies and interests and don't usually have a lot of spare time on our hands. Wendy and Nathan are avid readers and spend a lot of time on fiction of various sorts. Wendy is a canner of fruit and I guess we do that en masse since we have apples, cherries, pears, grapes, plums and apricots here on the land. We all pitch in to crush apples and get peaches canned when they come into season since we all like them and eat a lot of fruit.

"Justin is the family skier, mainly at Tod Mtn, one of B.C.'s best, and also a junior rated tennis player. So far he has managed to do that and keep on the honour roll at school all year. Now in grade 9 he has to duplicate the feat again. Both boys have large paper routes and so have that as a regular chore after school hours are through.

"Wendy likes sewing when time offers and makes many of the clothes she likes to wear.

"My hobbies vary. I am a private pilot with my own aircraft, CF-VYT, a Cessna 150, and have been an amateur radio operator for 27 years. My specialty there is in long range, DX work, and I have talked to most of the world's countries over the years. As well, I restore vintage cars, a hobby I've had for many years. I specialize in Packard and Studebaker. We have 5 Studebakers at present, one underway in the auto shop I have here. For the car buff records, we have 2 Silver Hawks, a GT Hawk, a Wagonaire and a Commander. On top of that Nathan collects beer bottles to help his finances and recently bought his own scooter. Since he is too young to ride it legally on the streets I rent it from him and ride it to work each day. I have a 3/4 ton truck as well for hauling wood, rock, campers, etc.

"Nathan and I have spent a lot of time in the fields exploring mining territory and older mines. We take our gold pans out to any promising creeks when in the bush on an expedition.

"The children used to collect butterflies but have ceased now and we all used to build models but have not done too much in recent months, after the house filled up. Wendy and I made wine and beer for many years and I have been the Merritt Fair judge for wine and beer for years now. But that is demanding of time and so does not get into the lists now.

"Somewhere amid all this I spend a lot of time on my computers and in reading. I use Commodore computers in my work and for easing the workload at school with my tests and other needs. That way I can get a great deal

accomplished at home and not have to feed things to the typing pools at the school office. (This letter is being typed on a new word processor which I am just mastering for long jobs.

"Our backgrounds are that Wendy was born in Victoria, B.C., and lived most of the early life in Brentwood Bay, 15 miles from Victoria. Her father, Rowland, is an interior decorator and has his own business in the southern cities of B.C. Wendy attended the University of Victoria and has her teacher's diploma from there. I got my BA degree for my specialties from University of Victoria and my Masters degree from the University of British Columbia. That second degree is in Spanish studies only.

"We taught at Duncan on Vancouver Island for two years and then left to travel Europe in a VW van for a year. We survived Europe's worst winter, sickness, cash shortage and other assorted charms and returned to live in Vancouver, B.C., where I was at the University. Wendy taught in elementary school in Vancouver.

"Thence we moved to Merritt in the interior where we both taught for two years, thence moving to Kamloops. In Merritt we gained a love of the interior landscape and life and I am not sure we would really want to leave this rangeland now. For hiking, fishing and camping it is hard to beat.

"My early days after leaving England were spent at 1733 Fairfield Road in Victoria where I lived with my grandparents, Mary and John Nankivell. My grandfather was in the Royal Navy and had surveyed much of the B.C. coast when he was younger, so he chose to return here after the War since my grandmother had a brother living in Victoria and also the old family home was up for sale in rather dilapidated shape.

"We came to Victoria in 1947, embarked from Southampton, England. We had stayed in Bournemouth (Poole) at Pen-mellyn house pending our departure from England. My grandfather died when I was in grade 12 at school and my grandmother a few years ago, after we moved here. She lived to see Justin born and came to visit us many times here in Kamloops. She did not see Nathan born, however. ...

"We just returned from a visit to Europe in July and got back in the middle of August. Anne Nankivell of Dusseldorf, Germany met us and we toured Lewes, Weymouth, Bournemouth and other spots catching up on family news and meeting people. In total, we met 24 relatives, including my Uncle Charles and his wife, Dorothy, whom we haven't seen in 16 years. Charles looked very hale and hearty and has put on a bit of weight ... "

CHARACTERISTICS OF THE CORNISHMAN

INSPIRE OUTSPOKEN VIEWS

Faults and Virtues Under Analysis

There have been many estimates of the character and idiosyncrasies of the Cornishman. One of the most outspoken was by the famous Cornish novelist Joseph Hocking.

"The Cornishman is a mixture, and a funny mixture at that," he wrote. "He is the most sentimental man alive, and at the same time, as hard as nails. To the outsider he has no sense of humour and yet he is bubbling over with it.

"In one sense he is mean and stingy and grabbing, and yet in another he is the most generous man alive. You don't know where to get him. He is deeply religious and yet in some ways he is a blank materialist. I have known many who seem gullible beyond words; all the same, if you try to get the better of them you will be terribly disappointed.

MORE FRIENDLY

"He is said by some to be superficial and unreflective, and yet I doubt whether you will find a higher standard of intelligence in the British Isles.... In no part of the country have I met people who have seen deeper into the heart of things, or express themselves more tersely or quaintly."

Many outsiders have given their versions, from the historian Norden's rather superficial "rocky land of strangers" to the letter of Sydney Horler, which described a certain class of Cornish as "treacherous, two-faced, sly, deceitful, flagrant humbugs (more especially when they profess themselves deeply religious, as many of them do) and altogether undesirable."

There was also D.H. Lawrence's blunt, "I don't like these people. They have got the souls of insects. . . They are all afraid - that's why they are so mean. But I don't really understand them."

Of the more friendly assessments there is Wilkie Collins's reference to the Cornish people's pertinacity and good humour, and the great courage of the coast-dwellers; and, more recently, this comment by the sculptor, Sven Berlin, who lived many years in St. Ives: "These people are industrious and practical...among themselves they are vital and, in their own way, humorous, kind and generous, and vividly poetic."

And a perceptive Devonian, W. Gore Allen, has observed that the Cornishman is a man of faith, his destiny to be looking inwards; and in praising the Cornish people's questioning spirit has summed them up as "gifted as a visionary and creative people."

No doubt there is some truth behind all these widely divergent views, but we shall get nearer the core of the matter by turning back to the Cornish viewpoint. This has been put forthrightly by the biographical writer, R. Glynn Grylls (Lady Mander), whose family have been settled at Lanreath, East Cornwall, for many generations:

'NOT NICE'

"The thing about the Cornish is that they are not nice; exciting and attractive, but not nice. They have colour enough to turn the spectacles of most onlookers pink, but it is not fast to light." The impulsiveness that goes as

far as magnanimity does not sustain generosity; the devotion, loyal to fanaticism, has no fidelity; the forth-comingness keeps much more back than reticence - like an iceberg two-thirds under the water, if there were not anything less like an iceberg than any Celt."

Now at first sight this may seem a bit hard, but if we are genuinely seeking the truth, such a comment is most helpful. For, carefully analyzed, it will be found to state very much what Joseph Hocking said; the difference being that he put it more tactfully. For, as Lady Mander goes on to explain, the Cornish, the Celtic races, cannot be judged by ordinary logical standards.

The essence of Celtic "truth" is that it is "faithful to mood, fickle to fact." In other words, the Cornish - like the Irish, the Welsh, the Scotch - have a way of their own about life.

A lot of this is tied up with hereditary and the past. It was George Meredith who drew attention to the influence of memory on the life of Celtic races like the Cornish.

LINKS WITH PAST

"The past is at their elbows continuously. The past of their lives has lost neither face nor voice behind the shroud, nor are the passions of the flesh, nor is the animate soul, wanting to it. Other races forfeit infancy, forfeit youth and manhood, with their progression to the wisdom age may bestow. These have each stage always alive, quick at a word, a scent, a sound to conjure up scenes, in spirit and in flame."

The Cornishman's sense of past is reflected in his peculiar sensitivity about his own land - more than most races the Cornish people are conditioned, shaped and fashioned by their land.

Thus it is perhaps not so surprising that pixies and fairies and other fantasies have been especially connected with Cornwall - for the Cornish people, through their land and its strange atmosphere, have unusually close links with the past.

In the same way, though they travel to the ends of the earth, the Cornish maintain a tremendous nostalgia for their home - hence the thriving Cornish associations all over the world, and the fact that so many Cornish people who work abroad seem to retire to the country of their birth when their working days are over.

'ELUSIVE'

This feeling has been very well put by A.L. Rowse, the Cornish historian and poet:-

"And I am free. Yet each step that takes me away
I see these evidences that I am bound,
Bone of my bone, flesh of my flesh, eye
Of my eye, one with the land that has denied me."

Cornwall has not denied Mr. Rowse, of course - the viewpoint is a typical projection; typical, that is, of the paradoxical nature of the Celtic temperament.

Let us turn finally, to that strange old Cornish fisherman who became a painter in his seventies, whose paintings now grace art galleries in many parts of the world - the late Alfred Wallis of St. Ives.

NANKIVELL

The original Visitation here of the County of Cornwall made here in the year 1620 records a Pedigree for Nankevell(e) of seven generations, beginning with one Tipett Nankevell of Collomb Major coming down to his great-great-grandson Richard Nankevell otherwise Tipett of St. Wenne in Cornwall who by Catherine Arscott had two daughters and a son and heir Richard Nankevell otherwise Tipett who was born in 1607.

The family is obviously one of ancient gentry, but strangely enough, it did not seem to have claimed Arms, nor were any allowed by the Heralds at the time of the Visitation in 1620. None of the other Records here, grants of Arms, Funeral Certificates, or later Pedigrees, contain any reference to Arms used by or to which the Nankevell's were entitled.

The conclusion must be therefore, that the family did not have Armorial Bearings and accordingly, although it would be an interesting and valuable study, for its own sake, nothing would be gained by tracing the genealogy of the Australian Nankevell's to link the same with those of Collomb Major or St. Wenne, so far as the maintenance of a right to Arms by descent is concerned.

The earliest occurrence of Arms that I can trace is in the unauthoritative Encyclopedia Heraldica of Berry, Circa 1810, where the Nankevell's have attributed to them "argent a cross humetty voided sable".

Burke's General Armory, of the 19th. Century, another unreliable authority (although it does give some indication of Arms in use by families mentioned therein) gives a similar Coat for Tippet and it might well be the case that the Coat with a cross derived originally from the Tipetts from which ancient house it seems likely that the Nankevell's descended.

The Sanson Institute of Heraldry has found the coat of arms granted to your name, and takes pleasure in submitting these findings. Centuries ago this coat of arms was recorded by the heralds, and this record is one of the few existing links between you and the past. It is these documents which have supplied us with the information necessary to find your arms.

Requiring the services of nine individuals you will see that the confirmation of any achievement of arms is not a hastily accomplished task. When the name was submitted it was first investigated for the possible changes and many different spellings which occur since its inception, probably in the 10th or 11th century.

Once the spelling had been determined, your order proceeded to our research department which evaluated the many references in our library. Our head researcher confirms all descriptions before they are recorded in preparation for the master art work. Our heraldically trained art department, all competent in the language of armory, interprets the descriptions into art forms. These are approved by the supervisor and transmitted to the reproduction office where copies are made and the original art work secured in our vault.

Look for the first mentioned heraldic color. This will indicate the background or shield color of the arms. The color of the figures usually follows the name of the charge. For example, 'A lion rampant argent' means that the lion is colored argent (or silver). "Of the last" means the last color mentioned in the description. COLORS:

GULESRED: Representing fire. In military application it signifies fortitude.
AZUREBLUE: The color of the sky, signifying loyalty, fidelity, and truth.
VERTGREEN: Nature is green and flourishing. Signifies youth and strength.
PURPURE....PURPLE: The tincture of kings and royalty, representing justice, majesty.
ERMINEWHITE: A white field with black ermine spots, signifies justice.
SABLEBLACK: The fur of the sable. A color associated with night and serenity.
ARGENTSILVER: This metal represents nobility, serenity and peace.

PARTITIONS OF THE FIELD:

WAVYFormed to represent the waves of the sea; signifies travel and adventure.

CHEVRON ...Presumed to have been adapted from the bow of the war saddle.
SALTIRE ...Said to be the cross of St. Andrews, symbolizing a suffering for a faith.
PALEMilitary strength and fortitude, It is bestowed on defenders of state.
BENDThe shoulder belt of armament or scarf worn about the shoulder and arm.
PILERepresents large pieces of wood used by engineers in fortification.
MASCLEAn open lozenge or diamond said to be the piece on which armor is fastened.
BEZANTPieces of gold found on pilgrimages to Byzantine lands.
TORTEAU ...A round figure representing a cake eaten before long battles.
MULLETStar-shaped and significant as a mark of honor and achievement.
CRESCENT ..A half moon with points outward. A celestial charge signifying faith.
FLEUR-DE-LIS..The three leaves represent faith, wisdom and valor.
TREFOIL ...Flower or herb of three leaves, emblem of fertility.

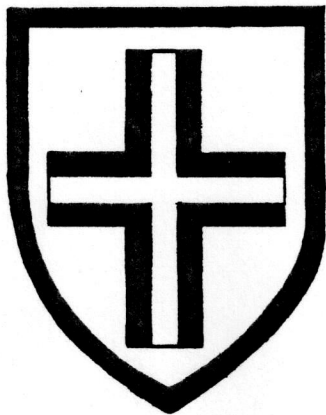

Introduction to NANKIVELL family 37-45 of Cornwall.

Family 37-45.

For family 37-45 the NANKIVELL name can be traced from about 1590 to 1990 for between 11 and 14 generations. Mostly these Nankivells live in England.

Family 37:J.

Family 37:J begins with Seraphin JOHN who died 1703 at Veryan, Cornwall.

A granddaughter Mary JOHNS was married in 1731 at Veryan to Anthony BANFIELD.

Richard BANFIELD, a great grandson to Mary and Anthony BANFIELD, in 1824 married Ann Nankivell PEARCE at Ruan Lanihorne. (See chart 37:PJJB:C, entry 37:PJJB:CABA.)

Richard Pearce BANFIELD, a son of Ann and Richard, moved to Australia where the lineage continued.

Emmaline BANFIELD, born 1832, was a fourth generation descendant, a great great granddaughter, of Mary and Anthony BANFIELD. Emmaline married William DUSTOW.

Florence Louisa DUSTOW, born 1889, a granddaughter to Emmaline and William DUSTOW, married Henry Theodore RUNDLE. (See chart 104:BE, entry 104:BHAA.) A daughter to Florence and Henry T. RUNDLE was born in 1926; she married and was living Veryan in 1986.

Families 37:P, 37:Y and 37:Z.

Petter NANKIVELL, coded 37:P, was born possibly about 1585. Though two grandchildren, Henry and John, are noted, only descendants of John have been traced to the present day. Family 37:P is basically the family history of the 17th century.

Families 37:Y and 37:Z are extensions into the 19th and 20th centuries of family 37:P. Family members bear surnames CREWES, FUGLER, JOHNS and RUNDLE.

Family 45.

Members of family 45 are descendants of John NANKIVELL who married Ann BROWN in 1775 at Ruan Lanihorne.

The eldest son of Ann and John was Henry NANKIVELL, coded 45:A. Henry's second marriage was to Philippa DILLON in 1834 at Ruan Lanihorne. For Philippa and Henry there are records for two lines of descent to the present day.

The second son of Ann and Henry was Peter NANKIVELL, coded 45:C. In 1804 Peter married Elizabeth RICHARDS at Ruan Lanihorne. Though seven of Peter's nine children married, only two sons of the youngest child, John Peter, are known. Only one line of descent through John Peter is known.
