11 Sept 1731

On "Pennslyvania Merchant" John Stedman, master- Jacob Mumma with three children under 16 - Jacob, Margaret, Frederick.

18 Sept. 1732

On pink "Johnson" David Crocket, master- Leonard and Julian Mumma with five children under 16- Anthony, Christian David, Julian, Cathrina.

13 Oct. 1747

On "TwoBrothers" Thomas Arnott, master- Johan Lorentz Momma

16 Sept. 1748

On "Patience" John Brown, master- Peter Mumma age 27.1.

leave their homes to cross the Atlantic Ocean in a sailing ship and settle in a strange land? These are a few of the questions we hope to explore in this and future issues.

Who Were They?

The tradition has passed down in several branches of the family that the Moumas were French protestents who were called Huguenots from the word hugnon which means one who walks in the night because they held their meetings at night for safty from the king's soldiers.

Many of the Huguenots were killed and many others fled from France. In 1593 King Henry IV signed the Edict of Nantes, which granted some religious freedom to the protestents. This lasted just eighty two years then the Edict of Nantes was repealed by Louis XIV, and thousands of Huguenots were again forced to flee to England, Ireland, Switzerland, and especialy to the German Platinate. Here they attended the protestent churches and later joined the Grenam emigration to the Colonies and were listed as Germans on their arrival.

Where Did They Come From?

We have two hints for a possible town of origin in what is now Gefmany. In the LDS microfilm records of the Heuchlhiem Reformed Church marriages we find:

" 1728 June 1 Heinrich Kaiser, smith and Eva Sybella Muhmaw of Gross Carlsbach".

And from the Gerolsheim Luthern Church marriage records:

"1789 on the 23rd. Feb. David Mumma, widower from America, born at Gross Calsbach and Gertraud Neumann, daughter of the Evangel-ical Luthern schoolteacher here, were united in lawful marriage.

If this is David son of Leonard who came in 1732, as seems almost certain then this identifies their origins. However, a search of the Gross Carlsbach Luthern Records reveal no Mumma entries. There are no Reformed Church records for Gross Carlsbacl on microfilm. 1.

David married (1) Ann Coffman²·He was assesed in Hempfield twp. from 1754-1775. In 1775 David Mumma of Baltimore county Maryland, and his wife Ann, deed to John Mumma of Hempfield twp. 211A. of land for £8003.

In the records of the First Reformed Church of Baltimore, we find David Mumma sen. and wife Maria Barbara had two children baptised. A son Wilhelm b. 20 April 1780 and a daughter Sarah b. 17 May1785. This would make Gertraud wife no. 3. David's death is recorded aged 64 in 1791. This would make him born about 1727 and therefore about five years old when they came to America.

Much more research needs to be done on this line.

221 John Mumma the progenitor of the Moomaws of Ross County; Ohio was born 5 March 1850 the son of 22 Christian and Margaret, dau of Nicholas and Elizabeth Zimmerman. He was confirmed in 1769 and married Anna Barbara, dau of Phillip and Magdalina Ranck.

New information that has come to light since the Kleopfer book gives them more children than were known at that time. I have listed them as nearly as possible in age order, but used the numbers as in

Kloepfer to avoid confusion.
