Mommas in Sweden

Last year when I was in Salt Lake for the N.G.S. Conference I met a genealogist from Sweden. I showed her a copy of Vol II no 3 in which I had reviewed the History of the Canadian Mumas by Robert Muma. On p 11 there is a reference to "Muma"being a common name in southern Sweden. She didn't think so but said she would see what she could find out. This year she came to Columbus and brought me a large roll of material she had found on the Momma family in Sweeden.Unfortunatly due to limitation on time and a language barrier I was not able to get a very good translation of all the material she brought. It seems from what I could understand that three sons of William Momma of Aacchen were

granted a coat of arms and a title or name of Reenstierna.

They seem to have been Iron workers .Possibly the three cones on the coat of arms represent early smelters.

There are also several references to printing, adlandet Momma manufacture of paper. and to shipping.

There is much more information concerning their occupations and places of residence that I am unable to make out. There also are several references to their being of the Reformed Church.

Aachen is near the present border of Germany, Belgium, and Holland.

This might be a good place for us to look for the ancestors of Leonard, Jacob, Conrad and Peter. It is not far from the area from which they came to Pennsylvania.

More about the Immigrants

Immigrants 1 Jacob Mumma who arrived on the Pennsylvania Merchant 11 September 1731 and 2 Leonard Mumma who arrived on the pink "Johnson" 18 September 1732, have been asssumed to be brothers, altho there is no proof of their relationship. (see vol.I p1)

Leonard was a member of the Muddy Creek Reformed Church and most of his children continued to belong to that denomination

No church records have been found for Jacob's family. So we can't be sure to what church they belonged.

Jacob settled in Lancaster township while Leonard moved to Earl Township. However Leonards two sons, George and David, both went to Hempfield Township as did Jacob's son Frederick. An interesting possible connection of the cousins (?) is found in a deed (Lancaster co. deed book M p 105) where among the heirs of John Coffman are: Anna wife of David Mummah and Maria wife of Jonas Nolt. Frederick Mumma married Fronica Nolt, and one of their sons was named Jonas. John Coffman was one of the early leaders in the Mennonite settlement of Lancaster Co. David Mumma's family may have been raised in the Mennonite church while they lived in Pennsylvania. After they moved to Maryland at least two sons were baptised, as adults, in the Reformed Church. Baltimore Co. Md..

Immigrant 4 Peter Mumma, arrived on the ship "Patience" 16 Sept. 1748 aged 27. He may have been a brother of Immigrant 3 Lorentz Mumma, who arrived the year before and is known to have had a brother in Pennsylvania (see Vol I p 14).

He settled in or near Lancaster and was married to Anna Maria before 1764 when they appear in the Birth and Baptismal Records of Trinity Lutheran Church, published in "Pennsylvania German Church Records" Vol.I. from which the information on their children and grandchildren is taken.

Merl F Sellers sent the following extract from Chapman's HISTORY OF KENT CO., MICHIGAN 1881.

"Benjamin J.Mumah, farmer near Sand Lake. He helped develop the community. Born in Clark Co. Ohio August 29, 1857 on the farm of his father Elias Mumah, who was born in 1832 in Ashland Co., Ohio. Elias moved to Clark County as a young farmer. He served in the Civil War three years. Elias married Barbara Kaufman, there were three children: 1.Amos; 2.Benjamin J; 3.John.

"Benjamin J. Mumah took up 72 acres of land near Sand Lake and cleared the forest from it. He became a village councilman, and was a Republican. He married Flora Chenoweth, daughter of Jacob and Sarah (Wagaman) Chencweth. Benjamin and Flora had three children: 1. Myrtle May (died at 17); 2. Sadie Jane (lives in Detroit); 3. Benjamin F. (farmer in Kent co. married to Hazel Perrin has and two children, Harold and Glenn). Benjamin and Flora were members of the M.E. Church of Sand Lake."
